2 - LANGUAGE ACTIVITIES

a) French Courses

From September 2024 to July 2025, we organised our usual three termly sessions in Mayenne, at **four levels** (Beginners, Intermediate, Intermediate Plus/Advanced & Advanced Plus), with our teacher, *Alain FAUCON*.

We thank most warmly *Alain FAUCON*, our teacher, for his renewed collaboration with our association since 2004. Finally, we are very grateful to *Simon King* for his role as Chair of our Languages Committee and to *Peter Woods* for his continuing hard work as our French Course Coordinator.

b) English-French Conversation Workshops

Our **Mayenne** workshops continue to have good participation. There were **15** afternoon workshops held with an average of **12** participants, including on average **6** French speakers and **6** English speakers. These sessions are held in the *Old Mairie* at 2pm on alternating Mondays. There were also **15** evening workshops held with an average of **15** participants, including on average **9** French speakers and **6** English speakers. One of the evening workshops had to be cancelled due to foggy weather. The evening workshops are held at Lycée Don Bosco at 8pm on alternating Mondays.

In Laval 18 workshops were held throughout the year, with an average of 6 participants, including on average 4 French speakers and 2 English speakers. These sessions are held at *Maison de Quartier des Fourches* at 8pm every other Wednesday.

In Lassay-les-Châteaux there were **34 workshops** held with an average of **9 participants**, including on average **5 French speakers and 4 English speakers**. These workshops are held at *Parc Albert Chevrier* at 6pm every Friday.

We are very grateful to *Armelle JAMELOT* (Laval), *Colette BERRON* and *Lynn CHESTERS* (Mayenne) and *Paul-Henri PROUST* (Lassay-les-Châteaux) for their hard work on coordinating our conversation workshops.

c) English Linguistic Support

A group of **15 native French-speaking EuroMayenne members** took part in this English support programme. These are small-group conversations led by native English-speaking EuroMayenne members. The French members really enjoyed these discussions, and all renewed their wish to participate for 2025-2026. Three additional people joined us for our last session in June.

Many thanks to our English volunteers, Stephen BOSTOCK, Simon KING, Sarah SMITH, Sandra & Jeffrey BISHOP, and Susan & Michael JAMESON for their availability and the relevance of the topics prepared for discussion. A special thank-you to Simon KING whose responsibility was the organization of the volunteers. With his departure Stephen BOSTOCK will be taking over this role for the 2025/2026 season.

d) <u>School Interventions</u>

EuroMayenne was invited to participate at two school interventions during the year.

The first was at the bilingual Les Mille Mots primary school in le Bourgneuf-la-Forêt, where we assisted at a 'Christmas Day in English' event in December.

The second event was at the Pierre et Marie Curie primary school in Mayenne in June, also a bilingual school, where we assisted at an 'English Day' that focussed on several countries around the world that spoke English.

Both events were most enjoyable and our volunteers were made to feel very welcome by both the staff and the children. Both events were of great benefit to the children.

b) Monthly Teas

Monthly Teas were held in the EuroMayenne office at La Visitation in Mayenne, on the first Thursday of each month from September to June. These monthly gatherings attracted an average of **15 members**. This year **29 members booked for the** *Galette des Rois* in January.Books, DVDs, Audiobooks and Jigsaw Puzzles are available to borrow during these gatherings. This year we did a clean out of the library eliminating some of the older content.

c) Interest Groups

Cinema Group

9 sessions were held from September 2024 to June 2025.

150 EuroMayenne members attended these sessions out of a total of 257 attendees, representing 58% of the audience, an **average of 17 participants** per séance (8 French speakers and 9 English speakers).

46 different members attended one of the sessions, 7 more participants than last year.

On average, 11 members attended the discussion after the film. Participation down this year but it is very often the same people.

The "Reflections of Irish and British Cinema" Festival in March allowed our members to enjoy for a week as many movies as possible.

The balance sheet of participations being satisfactory and increasing, the members of the cinema group decided to renew the screenings on the 3rd Friday of each month at 2 PM including the school holidays period in order to create regularity in this activity.

The programming period will extend from September 2025 to May 2026 with an alternation of English films with French subtitles, and we will relaunch the *Le Vox* cinema again in order to obtain if possible, a French film with English subtitles.

Craft Group

This group is a fun monthly get-together and some great crafts were made over the year. On average there were **9** participants at these sessions with room for more. So let us know if you are interested in crafting.

Costs are largely met by the group with a monthly contribution of around €3 each, dependent upon the materials required.

A few boxes of craft materials have been built up which participants can dip into when required.

Thanks to Lynn CHESTERS for her support and making the tea/coffee and biscuits at each session and all the attendees for making it such a fun monthly meeting.

Gardening and Nature Group

This year, the 'Gardening Group' became the 'Gardening and Nature Group' with *Mic DUFRASNE* joining the group and organizing nature events.

The Gardening and Nature Group met last year for an outdoor garden visit (*Chateau du Plessis-Bochard - 53*) on 12/09/2024 and then two indoor meetings on 11/10/2024 (*cur successes and failures 2024*) and 29/11/2024 (*creating microhabitats*). They had a March indoor meeting on 14/03/2025 (*hosting an open garden, making a container garden* along with a *seed swap*). On 23/04/2025 the group went on a nature walk to see wildflowers and spring plants (*Montsurs - 53*). In May they hosted a plant swap on 10/05/2025 at La Visitation (*Mayenne - 53*) and went on another nature walk this time Orchid hunting on 13/05/2025 (Saulges - 53). On 12/06/2025 they visited the *Jardins de la Mansonnière* (Orne - 61), and on 20/07/2025 *Le Domaine* (Epineux-le-Seguin - 53).

Walking Group

8 walks were organized during the year, all with an optional lunch. On average there were **11 participants**, including on average **3 French speakers and 8 English speakers**. Walks are held on the third Wednesday of every month at 10am at various locations centring around Mayenne.

With Lynn CHESTERS wishing to leave her leading role, Colette BERRON has offered to take over from her in managing this group.

Reading Group

The Reading Group met on the last Wednesday of each month except December in the home of one of our members in Evron. There were **12 participants** (maximum number agreed by group members), both English and French speakers. The books read were all suggestions from group members including "Froth on the Daydream" by Boris Vian and "The remains of the Day" by Kazuo Ishiguro.

We extend our warmest thanks to *Chris WICKS* for her generous hospitality and to all members of the group for their unfailing enthusiasm.

Well-Being Group

The Well-Being Group was started by a member on October 17th, 2024 and met 5 times during the year in October, December 2024, January, March and April 2025. There were **8 participants** on average at these sessions, which often included doing a bit of yoga. Unfortunately, this group has disbanded and will not be continuing into the 2025-2026 year.

Our *«Association EuroMayenne»* public page has 598 «followers» (581 in 2024). We encourage all our members to check this page regularly. This year, our Communications Committee decided to stop our interest groups' private pages, as they were rarely consulted.

d) Bilingual guide for medical emergencies

This guide is designed to help native anglophones make phone calls to medical emergency services. Since we had obtained a €1000 funding from FDVA (Fonds de Développement de la Vie associative), 3400 copies were printed in June 2025 by students at Lycee Leonard de Vinci in Mayenne. Our Communications Committee is now finding out how this guide could be distributed widely in our department. It is available at our Monthly Teas at La Visitation in Mayenne and it has been emailed to all our members.
